KEYNOTE SPEAKER ANNIE TE ONE

Annie is a 27 year old Te Ātiawa and Ngāti Mutunga woman. She has grown up in the area where her Iwi are from in Wellington, which has shaped the types of work, and research she pursues. Annie is a lecturer at Victoria University of Wellington and teaches in Māori studies. She currently teaches courses on Māori society and culture and the Treaty of Waitangi. Annie is in the final stage of her PhD which has focussed on relationships between Māori and local government. In particular her research has focused on reifying Māori governing values and how these influence the way relationships are managed between Māori and local government. She is interested in Māori and Indigenous politics and in particular Indigenous political processes which operate independent of the state. Annie will be presenting a Keynote address on the topic of 'Culture in Governance' as part of the Indigenous Youth in Governance Masterclass.
