














Aboriginal Allied Health Network Forum

The Aboriginal allied health forum is a collaboration between the Health Education and Training Institute (HETI), the Ministry of Health (Workforce Planning & Talent Development Branch) and Indigenous Allied Health Australia (IAHA).

The forum will be held at the National Centre of Indigenous Excellence (NCIE) which is located on Gadigal country in the Eora Nation.

The aim of the forum is to support the education, cultural and career development needs of existing and emerging Aboriginal allied health staff. The forum facilitator is Justin Noel, a Dhungutti man and principal consultant, Origin Communications Australia.
