



How long will my information be kept?

Your name and information will stay on the Clinical Register for each pregnancy.

If you no longer want your information on the Clinical Register you can ask for your name and information to be taken off. You can ask Health Staff for your name to be removed at any time.

Adding your name to the Clinical Register

Clinic staff will provide you with information about the clinical register.

If you do not want your name on the clinical register please let the clinic staff looking after you know that.

Information Collected for the Register

The information that your Health Professional will collect is Information about your diabetes, pregnancy and your baby's birth.

Other health information that is important for health staff to know about your diabetes and your pregnancy.

For example, what happened in your past pregnancies, if you have other medical problems such as high blood pressure, any tests that you had during your pregnancy - blood tests and ultra-sounds.

Your Health Information

Information about the health of women in the Northern Territory who have diabetes in pregnancy and their babies is regularly reported to clinicians and health services to assist with monitoring and improving health care services.

Reports containing health information from the clinical register may be published or discussed at health meetings. These reports never contain your personal details or private information such as your name or contact details.

The Clinical Register Purpose

The Clinical Register is for all women who have Diabetes in Pregnancy; this includes Type 1, Type 2 and Gestational Diabetes. The register contains information about your pregnancy, your diabetes and your baby's birth information.

This register helps Health Professionals know how many women have diabetes during pregnancy, assists us to plan for future delivery of health services and assesses if treatment provided is working.

Your Health Professional will explain what the Clinical Register is and how it will be used for the management of your pregnancy.

Diabetes in pregnancy can cause problems for Mothers and their babies.

Diabetes can be controlled by:

- Eating the right amounts of healthy foods
- Being physically active
- Checking your Blood Glucose Levels
- Taking your Diabetic medications including Insulin
