Did you know?



blindness and low vision services

- Vision loss accounts for 11% health gap
- Blindness rates are 6 times higher in Indigenous adults
- Many people with other disabilities also have vision loss to consider e.g. up to 75% children with Cerebral Palsy
- Vision Australia is a charity that supports people with blindness and low vision

- Blurred vision
- Sensitivity to glare
- Reduced ability to perceive colours
- By 80 most people will have some degree of cataract



Diabetic Retinopathy


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- Reduced vision
- Sensitivity to glare
- Decreased night vision
- Approximately 15%

 diabetes have
 diabetic retinopathy*

Aged-Related Macular Degeneration

- Blurring of central vision
- Loss of ability to see fine detail
- Need for more light
- Leading cause of blindness for people over 55





Glaucoma



- Reduced side vision
- Blurring of central vision in advanced cases
- Genetically inherited



Retinitis Pigmentosa

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- Tunnel vision
- Night blindness
- Progressive and degenerative
- Hereditary and currently no treatment



Children



- Genetic
- Maternal infection during pregnancy
- Extreme prematuring
- Tumours, injury, poisons

An estimated 1: 2500 children in Australia has a vision impairment not correctable with glasses






