# Research Assistant

## **Position Overview**

The Research Assistant will assess cognitive function, mental health and social integration, working with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people who have recently sustained a traumatic brain injury. The incumbent forms part of a multi-disciplinary team working in northern Australia (including the Northern Territory and Queensland), as part of the project "The transition from hospital to home: A longitudinal study of Indigenous traumatic brain injury." The casual research assistant will primarily work within the Royal Darwin Hospital to recruit and assess participants, as well as conduct follow up assessments with participants in remote communities in the Northern Territory.

# **Special Conditions**

- It is a requirement of this position to travel throughout remote Northern Territory communities including Darwin and the Top End. This includes overnight stays, after hours work on occasion, and travel in light planes.
- It is a requirement of this position to hold a current "C" class Queensland Driver's Licence without restriction.

#### **Selection Criteria**

Selection and appointments will be assessed against selection criteria.

#### **Essential**

- 1. Degree qualification in Psychology, Allied Health, Health Science, Social Work or other relevant area with relevant work experience or an equivalent combination of experience and/or education and/or training.
- 2. An Honours degree or equivalent research experience of at least one year.
- 3. Proven experience in conducting research with humans including the collection, analysis, interpretation.
- 4. Demonstrated well developed written and oral communication skills and experience in communicating research to a variety of stakeholders through various media including journal articles, conference presentations, online and through social media.
- 5. Demonstrated significant organisational, time management and problem-solving skills.
- 6. Ability to adapt to, and work effectively in new environments and with people of different cultures.

#### Desirable

- 1. Experience in research collaboration across multiple organisations including Universities and Health Services and knowledge or expertise in brain injury research or service provision.
- 2. Experience working in remote Indigenous communities.
