

Remote Health Experience

Saturday 6th to Monday 8th March 2021

‘Walking in each other’s shoes, Honouring each other’s stories’

This Remote Health Experience (RHE) is an inter-professional, experiential learning activity where all participants will learn about remote issues in context. The learning is intended to be collegiate, and fun. During the weekend, you will have the opportunity to learn, problem solve, and discuss remote issues across disciplines in an environment led by remote practitioners. This activity involves nursing, medical, paramedical, allied health and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. The objectives are for students to develop:-

- an understanding of remote health,
- inter-professional communication and respect for other professions and
- understanding and confidence in working with Aboriginal clients.

The weekend has been designed by a collaborative team from Flinders University, Batchelor College, Indigenous Allied Health Australia (IAHA), Sunrise Aboriginal Health Service, Katherine Hospital and the Banatjarl Strongbala Wimuns Grup. The Remote Health Experience models the inter-professional training and practice and the cross cultural environment that people will encounter in their course placements and remote practice. 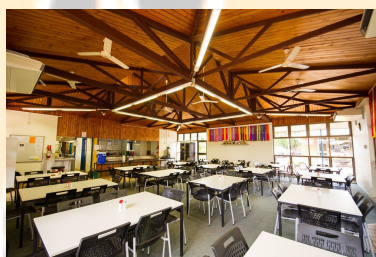
Self-contained Single room accommodation – at the CDU Rural Campus.
