IAHA is a national member-based Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander organisation that has developed the culturally centred program to support high school students in gaining their educational qualifications.

The paid Traineeship spans over two years, providing you with on-the-job experience along with the ability to gain a Certificate III qualification in Allied Health Assistance. You will receive credits towards your Year 12 Higher School Certificate. We will help you grow your confidence, build on your work-readiness and employability skills for the health sector.
