The 2023 IAHA National Conference will be held on the traditional lands of the Kabi Kabi people of the beautiful Sunshine Coast. Kabi Kabi lands stretch from the eastern part of the coastal ranges including the volcanic Glasshouse Mountains and the great Mary River valley which flows from the Conondale Ranges to the sea near Maryborough.

The Sunshine Coast is made up of more than 100km of sparkling coastline. Stretching from the coastal city of Caloundra, near Brisbane, to the Great Sandy National Park in the north, the Sunshine Coast is home to pretty villages, renowned surf spots and spectacular rural hinterland.


