IUIH will facilitate the growth of culturally respectful physiotherapy clinicians through yarns, monthly activities, and resources to ensure culturally responsive appropriate services and programs that support clients are delivered across the network.

Day to day duties will involve:

- Travelling to community health service clinics to provide clinical services which include clinic-based appointments, group programs and home visits as needed.
- Varied caseload- Providing culturally responsive assessments and intervention for adults and children across the lifespan, from acute to chronic presentations.
- Involvement in service delivery and running of Cardiac and Pulmonary rehabilitation programs.
- Attend team meetings, professional development, socialisation activities and organisational meetings rostered.
- Collaboration and working within a multi-disciplinary team with wayfaring or initiation and participation of case conferencing with other disciplines and clinicians
