IAHA is supporting the Katherine Region Interprofessional Student Placement Program (KRISPP), to increase Allied Health student placements in the region.

There are two different placement opportunities available for Speech Pathology (SP) and Occupational Therapy (OT) final year domestic students. These placements offer unique opportunities for interdisciplinary work with Indigenous people in a remote setting.

SCHOOL-BASED PLACEMENTS, COINCIDING WITH THE NORTHERN TERRITORY SCHOOL TERMS.

There are 4 x SP and 4 x OT placements available per term.

Allied Health students are supported within the school by the special education teachers. The schools participating have dedicated space for the program and school facilities include 'Engine Rooms' to support self-regulation and learning.



PLACEMENTS BASED IN AN ABORIGINAL COMMUNITY - CONTROLLED HEALTH ORGANISATION (WURLI WURLINJANG).

There are 2 x OT and 2 x SP places per placement.

Placements occur four times a year for 7-8 weeks, with one week of orientation prior to the commencing clinical placement. Clinical placement consists of four days per week with opportunities for interdisciplinary learning, cultural experiences and community visits on Fridays. Wurli placements will also coincide with the school terms to encourage greater peer support.
