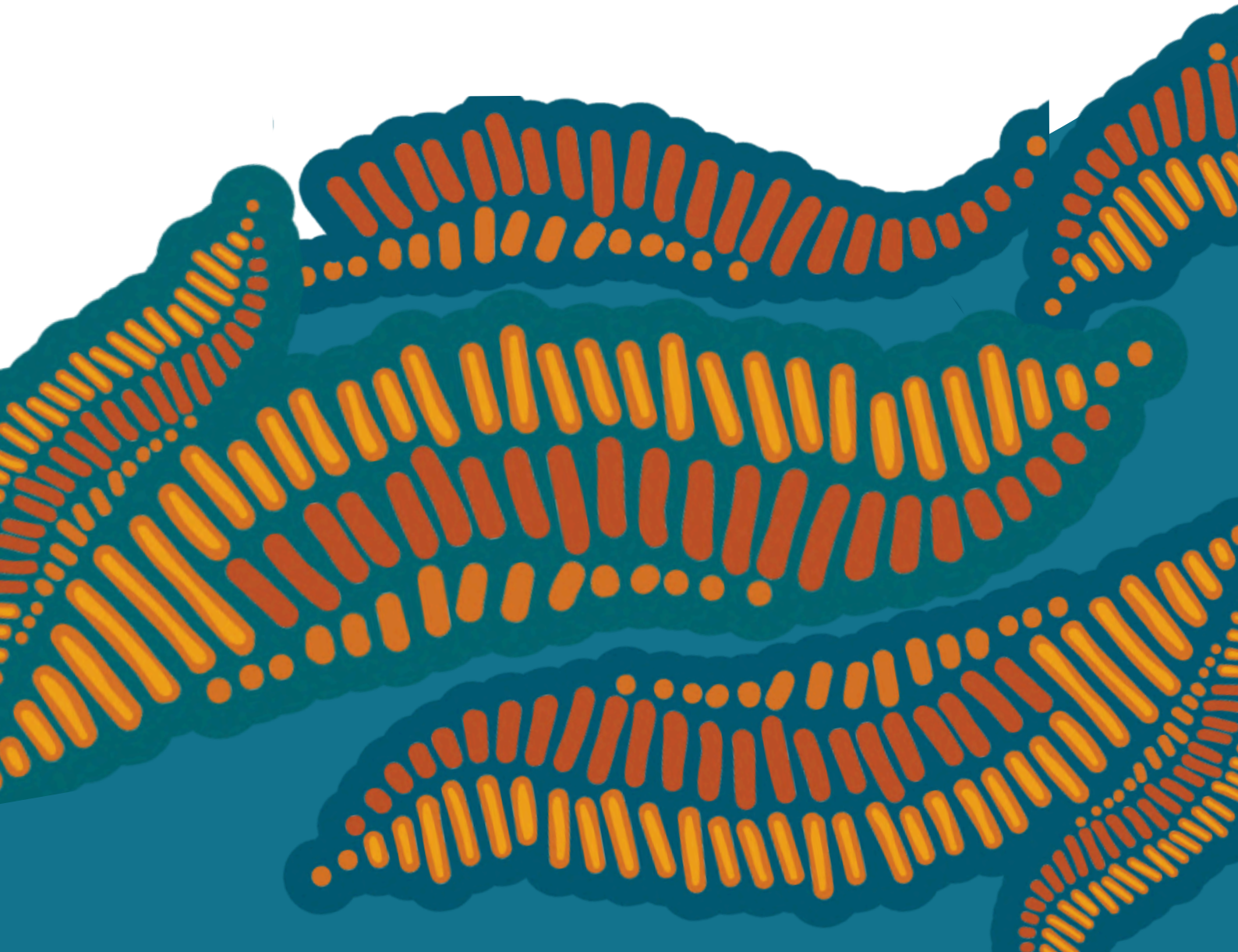

Location

The 2025 IAHA National Conference will be held on the traditional lands of the Kabi Kabi people of the beautiful Sunshine Coast. Kabi Kabi lands stretch from the eastern part of the coastal ranges including the volcanic Glasshouse Mountains and the great Mary River valley which flows from the Conondale Ranges to the sea near Maryborough.

The Sunshine Coast is made up of more than 100km of sparkling coastline. Stretching from the coastal city of Caloundra, near Brisbane, to the Great Sandy National Park in the north, the Sunshine Coast is home to pretty villages, renowned surf spots and spectacular rural hinterland.

Maroochydore is the capital of the region but is pleasingly far from being a bustling city. With its funky cafes, multicultural cuisine and thriving live music scene.

Venue

The venue for the 2025 IAHA National Conference is the Novotel Twin Waters Resort located on the Sunshine Coast, Queensland. The resort is set in tropical gardens surrounding a central private lagoon with its own sandy beaches. These animals and birds provide us with our Totems, food and clothing and have supported our survival for tens of thousands of years. They are a respected integral part of our lives.

We have chosen animals and birds that are important to our people to represent our sponsorship packages. These packages use the language of the Ngambri (Kamberri) Walgalu peoples whose lands our Head Office is situated on.

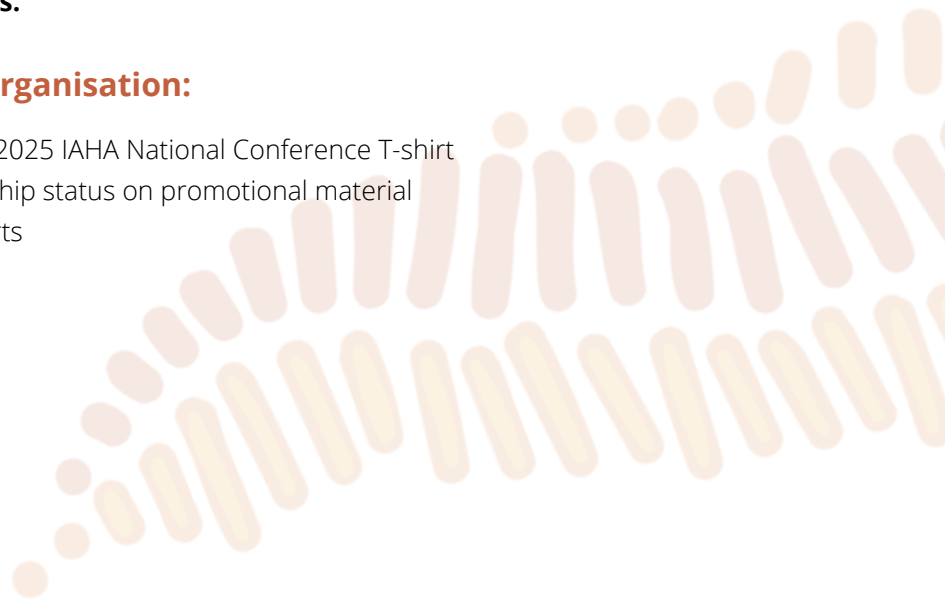

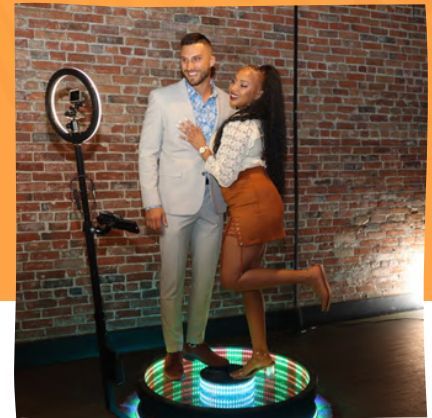

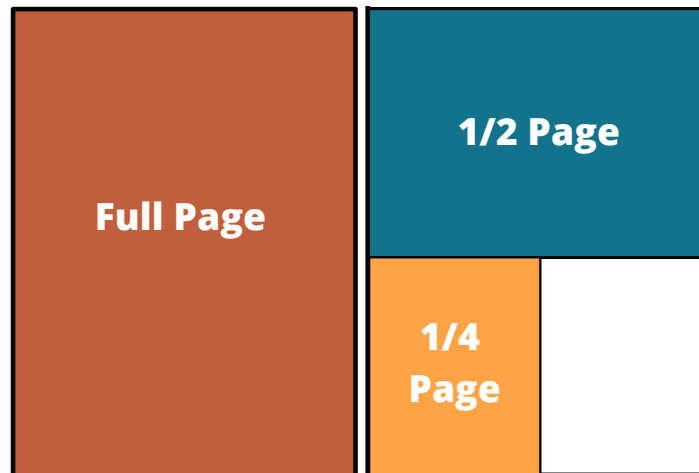
