

IAHA NT Workforce Development provides established programs for individuals and organisations looking at career pathways, employment or building a local workforce in health and related sectors.

IAHA NT Workforce Development recognise and value the centrality of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures, knowledges, and perspectives, which are reflected in our programs and workforce development approaches which value and honour Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander ways of knowing, being, and doing. To achieve our vision IAHA NT Workforce Development take a holistic approach to the success and wellbeing of the individual, their family and community, providing culturally informed and responsive supports, to support and empower Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to pursue career pathways. Community and culture are at the centre of everything we do.

IAHA Group Training is a Group Training Organisation registered in the Northern Territory, providing employment services and support, to help enable Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander trainees and apprentices to succeed. IAHA NT Workforce Development facilitate culturally informed, holistic, and wraparound support to learners throughout their education and training, addressing needs while building on the strengths and supports, including family and community, of the individual.

IAHA Group Training offers the following services:

- Recruitment and selection, including advertising, aptitude testing, pre-screening, and shortlisting
- All employer obligations, including payroll, workers compensation, PAYE and superannuation
- Management of all off the job and on the job training and assessment
- Holistic, <u>360 wrap-around support services</u>
- Issues management
- Administration of training contracts
- Employment and workforce planning advice
- Cultural responsiveness support for employers
- Coordination of all state and federal requirements, including training contracts
- Regular site visits (usually monthly) to monitor progress and liaise with trainees, host supervisors and other stakeholders as required
- IAHA Group Training recognises and complies with the National Standards for GTOs
