Currently the National Coordinator for Tackling Indigenous Smoking and former Chancellor of the University of Canberra, Professor Calma previously served as the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Social Justice Commissioner and the Race Discrimination Commissioner. Professor Calma has a special interest in Indigenous education, employment and training programs.

He has been a prominent advocate for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health, pioneering the Close the Gap campaign and more recently leading the national effort to tackle Indigenous smoking.

June Oscar AO is a proud Bunuba woman from the remote town of Fitzroy Crossing in Western Australia's Kimberley region.

She is a strong advocate for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander languages, social justice, women's issues, and has worked tirelessly to reduce the impacts of Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD). In 2013 June was awarded an Officer of the order of Australia for distinguished service to the Indigenous community of Western Australia, particularly through health and social welfare programs.

June completed her seven-year term as Australia's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Social Justice Commissioner in 2024. During this time, she published the landmark Wiyi Yani U Thangani (Women's Voices) Report and continues as Chair of the Wiyi Yani U Thangani Institute for First Nations Gender Justice based at the Australian National University.



Location

Boorloo (Perth) stands on the traditional lands of the Whadjuk Noongar people. The name translates to “place of the quokka,” paying homage to the unique flora and fauna found in the region. It symbolizes the harmonious relationship between the Noongar people and the land they have called home for thousands of years.

The Noongar people have lived in the south-west corner of Western Australia for at least 45,000 years. There are several language groups that make up the Noongar, including the Whadjuk, who are the traditional owners of the land around Boorloo.

Venue

Uniquely located in Perth’s central business district on the banks of the Swan River and adjacent to Elizabeth Quay, the Perth Convention and Exhibition Centre (PCEC) is Western Australia’s only dedicated and purpose-built convention, exhibition, and meeting venue.

Perfectly positioned on the doorstep of Elizabeth Quay, PCEC is one of the most centrally located venues in Boorloo – just a short stroll from hotels, landmarks and riverside paths.

PCEC is surrounded by some of Perth’s top hotels, including The Ritz-Carlton, Adina, InterContinental, and Parmelia Hilton – all within easy walking distance.

In Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures we do not see a hierarchy when we look at and think about our animals, plants or birds, as they are equal with us, as we all play a role in our collective ecosystem with and for our peoples and our generations to come.

These animals and birds provide us with our Totems, food and clothing and have supported our survival for tens of thousands of years. They are a respected integral part of our lives.

We have chosen animals and birds that are important to our people to represent our sponsorship packages. These packages use the language of the Ngambri (Kamberri) Walgalu peoples whose lands our Head Office is situated on.



